September 21, 1913 - January 25, 2003

Ms. Cleopatra Jackson, known to her family and friends as Cleo, was called home on January 25, 2003 at Genesis Homewood Center. She was born September 21, 1913 in Richmond, Virginia to the late Henry and Maria Jackson. She was educated in the Richmond, Virginia public schools and graduated from Armstrong High School. She later graduated from the University of the State of New York in 1948 where she received her Practical Nurse license. She worked for the New York State Health Department until her retirement. Instead of marrying, Ms. Jackson decided to dedicate her life to helping others. She attended Riverside Church where she volunteered with their Outreach Ministry. She was also a volunteer at the Lennox Hill Hospital in New York for several years. Ms. Jackson was a member of the Chapter Excelsior #16 O.E.S. where she served as the Heroine Ruth. She was also a Past Matron. She was a member of the Oriental Grand Chapter O.E.S. where she served on the Charity Committee and she chaired the Women's Day Committee. Ms. Jackson resided in New York until May 2002 when illness required her to relocate to Baltimore to be closer to family. She resided at Brightview Assisted Living until her health declined and she was relocated to Genesis Homewood Center, where she departed this life.
