Cleveland was formally educated in the Calhoun County public schools in South Carolina. At an early age, he joined Mt. Carmel Baptist Church, accepting God as his personal Savior. Later he joined the Armed Forces serving in the C.C. Camp where he traveled throughout the United States and abroad. After an honorable discharge, Cleveland moved to Baltimore, where he was employed by Sparrows Point Steel Mill and Little Potts Department Store.
