There are those who live their lives guided by a certain creed which frames their actions and intention. For Clifford Hutchinson, the guiding the creed was borrowed from the old hymn, "if I can help somebody as I pass along the way, then my living will not be in vain." On February 17, 1939, CLIFFORD ALVIN HUTCHINSON was born to Eugene and Fannie Hutchinson in Richmond, Virginia. He was the fifth child of six children and the youngest son. Fondly known by his siblings and parents as "Puddin", Clifford developed his strong love of his family and friends that sustained him throughout his life. He departed this life on May 22, 2011 following a long illness surrounded by loving family.

During time of segregation and strictly enforced Jim Crow laws in the South, Clifford was educated in the Catholic School System of Richmond and was often the lone African American child in his class. Upon graduation from high school, he enlisted in the United States Air Force. When it was time to re-enlist, Clifford became a proud member of the United States Marine Corp. it was during this period that he attend the University of Maryland. After completing his military service, Clifford was employed by UPS as a Truck Driver until he retired.

On June 11, 1966, Clifford married the love of his life, Augustine Goldie Jeffries Hutchenson. With the addition of their son, Gregory Alvin Hutchinson

in 1972, the family became complete. Together, Cliff and Goldie created a home that was the site of family holiday gatherings, cookouts, and parties. In addition to being a devoted and loving husband and father, he was a favorite brother, brother-in-law, and uncle to his many siblings, in-laws, nieces and nephews. He could often be found serving as a cheering member of the support for various family members as they participated in a variety of activities from school functions to walk-a-thons. In addition to family events, he was an enthusiastic sports fan, who faithfully supported his hometown teams the Baltimore Orioles and the Baltimore Ravens.

Always a man who liked having a rhythm and order to his day, his daily routine seldom wavered. He generally started his day with a daily walk, which led to a gathering of friends for coffee and discussion at the local McDonald's. An avid fan of current events, Cliff could always be found reading the newspaper from cover throughout the day and sharing his thoughts about the issues featured. Another daily passion was "The Price is Right." Everyone knew where he was during the show's time slot and knew not to disturb him.

He was the quite and steady rock that the family leaned on in times of trouble and could be relied upon to offer his wisdom, support and affection in good times and bad. The love that he shared with his wife serves as a living example of true partnership and marriage for all of those who knew them.

Left behind to cherish his memory: is his wife and partner of forty-five years, Augustine Goldie Hutchinson three grandchildren, Gregory Alvin Hutchinson, Jr., Tiffany Hutchinson and Terrell Hutchinson; his siblings, Bessie H.
