



Clifton Anderson

February 18, 1925 - August 30, 2024

CLIFTON ANDERSON was born on February 18, 1925, in Baltimore, Maryland. He was the third child born to the late Charles and Agatha Anderson. With his daughter by his side, and at the age of 99, he was called to rest while at home on August 30, 2024.

Clifton was educated in Baltimore City Public Schools where he was a favorite among his teachers due to his preparedness and likeability. A lifelong learner, he enjoyed staying abreast of current affairs and reading books on a multitude of topics with his favorite being The Holy Bible. He also frequently listened to talk radio.

When Clifton was 18, he joined the U.S. Army and fought in the South Pacific during World War II. His time in the military left an indelible imprint as he would often share countless stories of his experiences from that time mesmerizing all who listened. This period of his life greatly influenced him as he would stop to give full attention to documentaries or movies of the war. Clifton was the recipient of several decorations and citations.

In the late 1960s, Clifton joined Christ Temple Apostolic Faith Church where he was baptized and received the salvation of the Lord Jesus Christ under the leadership of the late Bishop Willard E. Saunders Sr. Clifton's faith was extremely important to him guiding how he navigated his life. As his faith grew,

he would serve the Lord in many capacities including Deacon, Sunday School Teacher, Trustee, Choir Member, and Usher. In subsequent years, he became a member of East Baltimore Church of Christ under the leadership of Minister Kevin Bethea where his faith and knowledge continued to grow

. Clifton worked a number of years at Shelby's Men's Clothing Factory before joining the United States Postal Service where he was a mail clerk memorizing dozens of townships and zip codes. He retired in January 1986.

Clifton married the late Almedia Johnson raising six children, two of which they shared, together. In later years, he married the former Alma Baker.

Clifton was predeceased by two stepsons Gossie Talbott, Jr. and Purnell Walker Diggs: his three brothers, Clarence, Charles, Leroy, and his sister Estella.

Clifton leaves to mourn and cherish his memory: his children, Carolyn (Stonewall) Morris, Constance M. Glass, Carl (Sylvia) Anderson, and Sheila A. Outlen; his grandchildren, great-grandchildren, great-great grandchildren, and a host of nieces, nephews, and friends. The family wishes to thank his health care workers who made his life comfortable and pleasant during his later years. He will be missed, but we all have the hope within that we will see him again.
