July 11, 1932 - March 25, 2008

Clinton Douglas Brockenborough was born on July 11, 1932 in Hanover County, Virginia; the 8th of 15 children born to the late Savannah Temple and the late William Jefferson Brockenborough. He was educated in the Hanover County school system, attending Pleasant Grove Elementary School and The Hanover Training Center. He was baptized at an early age, in Beatty's Lake, by the late Rev. E. C. Kent, and became a member of the First Union Baptist Church in Mechanicsville, Virginia. When Clinton came of age, he eagerly served his country, joining the U.S. Army. In his early adulthood, Clinton moved to Baltimore, MD. On November 2, 1957, Clinton married the former Frances Fitzferald. Soon after they wed, Clinton and Frances established their first home in Philadelphia, PA. While in Philadelphia, Clinton first worked at a lumber company and later operated his own GULF gas station from 1969 to 1975. In 1975, he and Frances moved back to the state of his birth. In Richmond, he was first employed by Reynolds Metals Company and later helped his nephew, Berkley with his moving business. He was preceded in death by his mother and father; brothers, Floyd, Abraham, Wilbert, Simon, Robert, and James; sisters, Marie, Aretha, Carrie, and Lillian. Among those he leaves with cherished memories are his wife, Frances; son, Douglas Brockenborough; stepson, Alphonso Brooks, four grandchildren; three sisters, Florine and Majoicy Brockenborough, and Sarah B. Thompson; one brother, George Taylor (Christine); brother-in-law, Christopher
