November 25, 1925 - June 7, 2018

CORA LEE JACKSON, fondly known as "Sweets", daughter of the late Jack Jackson and late Cora Lee Pickens, was born on November 25, 1925 in Columbia, South Carolina. In 2015, Cora Lee Jackson was diagnosed with dementia and lost her sight. After enduring dementia, she departed this life at the age of 93, on June 6, 2018.

Cora received her education in the South Carolina public school system. Later, she and her dad relocated to Baltimore, Maryland. It was then that she met and married the late Rev. Webster Taylor. They owned trucks distributing steel for many years. From this union she had six children. They affectionately called her Mothe'. Cora went on to work for Bugle Laundry and Johns Hopkins. In 1972, Cora was remarried to the late Willie Jackson, until his passing in 1978.

Cora always had a desire to increase her spiritual knowledge, prayed every day and all throughout the day. She was a dedicated member of New Testament Pentecostal Church where her brother Elder Harvey Hall was the founder pastor. She was known for calling on the name of the Lord. Even when her mind was failing, if she heard the 23rd Psalm she could recite it better than anyone in the room. She was a strong dedicated mother who prayed with and for her children wholeheartedly. Every Friday was Pentecostal Friday for the entire family followed by a large feast. She fed us spiritually and

physically.

In her early days she had lots of friends. With limited education she held things together, her home, finances and appearance. Her home was kept with beautiful flowers, lavished drapes and antique chairs. She was always ready to give and have family gatherings; she loved laughter. She always wanted her children to look great and have the best of things.

Her last days were peaceful all the way to the end. Her daughter Sylvia Hardison preceded her in death.

She leaves to cherish her memory: two daughters, Louise McBrown and Juliet Hill (Clarence Hill); three sons, Webster Taylor (Joyce Taylor), Robert Taylor (Joyce Taylor) and Jack Taylor (Marilynn Taylor); a sister, Laura Johnson; thirteen grandchildren, nineteen great grandchildren and a host of family and friends.
