The Legendary Life of Corey Reid

COREY “SHA RULE’ REID was gifted to the world on July 2, 1978 in Brooklyn, New York to the late Robert Nathaniel Reid and the late Viola Reid. God graciously reached down and transitioned him into an angel to watch over his family and friends during the morning of August 27, 2019. He was preceded in death by his nephew Rameik.

Corey started his formal education in the New York Public School System, and later attended Huguenot High School in Richmond, Virginia. Shortly after, he obtained his electrical wiring certification from Potomac Job Corp Center in Washington, DC. He furthered his education at J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College, majoring in mathematics. With an intense passion for exploring and repairing electronics, he pursued a career in technology, and was employed as an appliance technician for several large corporations including Mr. Appliance, General Electric and Sears.

Known for his infectious smile, extreme sense of humor, strong & gentle demeanor, and generous heart; Corey’s presence would instantly ignite happiness to anyone that came in contact with him. His main objective in life was to prank any and everybody—with no limits! He loved laughter, having fun, and creating hilarious everlasting memories. A masterful teacher, Corey was

charismatic and socially influential. Even as a young kid, he demonstrated exceptional intelligence, exceeding all commonly accepted classroom standards.

Straight from the battle grounds of Fort Greene, Brooklyn during the hip hop era; he was the last born of a legendary matriarch, becoming the Prince and young leader of his family. He was the baby boy of a very culturally aware family, that taught him to always seek the highest level of truth about his heritage, black greatness, and the social injustices that impacted his community. As a child, he played among Gods and Earths during monthly parliaments and attended Muhammad's University of Islam.

Corey grew to be a talented lyricist, considered one of the greatest among his peers. A man of many talents, his inquisitive mind allowed for many interest and hobbies to include photography, gaming, fishing and cooking. He was a Cowboys and Knicks fan, tech-head, food connoisseur and excellent cook who enjoyed creating new delicious meals from scratch. During pastime, he watched animal shows, videos about professional pyrotechnics, and freak science. But his absolute favorite pastime was watching the latest battle raps. He found serenity in riding in his clean black Lexus, dark in the night with an ill sound system playing his favorite hip hop.

Although Corey was the youngest brother of nine siblings, he was the big brother and mentor to his best-friend and fellow Chrymie, Gee; who exemplified unconditional brotherhood. Gee and Corey had a bond that very few get to experience in their lifetime. They shared a friendship without conditions; they were fellow comrades and confidants. Gee was his right hand man, his moral compass, his anchor; his brother for life.

Corey leaves to cherish his precious memories: the love of his life and fiancé Tieshena (Tie); one daughter, Siva; his four sisters Lorraine, Lenelle (Sue
