September 21, 1908 - August 7, 2004

The afternoon of August 7, 2004 was a time of rejoicing in Heaven. God called one of His most precious children, Cornelia Reed Jackson, home. We were blessed with her presence for ninety-five years; it was time for her to claim the victory. At the time of her death, she was at the home of Mrs. Ella Torain, an Assisted Living Facility in East Baltimore. Cornelia Reed was born September 21, 1908 in Brownsville, Tennessee to Lila Newmon Reed and Elias Reed. All of her siblings preceded her in death. She was a graduate of the level of education in Brownsville and later she moved to Memphis, Tennessee and on to Baltimore, Maryland with her employer to care for their children. Living in Baltimore, she attended night school and became a Cashier for Baltimore City Public Schools. She worked until her husband's health failed and she came home to care for him until his death. Cornelia, who was fondly called "Ms. Lady," was married to the late Daniel E. Jackson and from this union, they adopted one son, Joseph Daniel Jackson (now deceased). She was a devoted foster mother and foster grandmother to Ethel Mae Mitchell, Lisa, Martha and Sandra Edmond. Sandra Jackson joined Grace Memorial Baptist Church and later she her husband came to Israel in 1965 with Christian Experience under the leadership of the late Rev. Edmond D. Meade, Pastor. She was not a bench member; she came and joined the Pastor Aid Ministry, planned many bus trips, Deaconess Ministry and the Senior Citizen Ministry. (Since its inception) Deaconess Jackson leaves to cherish her memory: a goddaughter, Mrs. Ethel Mae (Wallace) Mitchell; godsons, Clarence White Jr.,

and Donald White; friend, Dr. Odessa D. (Vernon) Dorkins; nephew, Joseph (Louella) Hyman; cousin, Linda Bell; devoted friends, Mrs. Lillie Williams and Mrs. Roberta Phillips; and other relatives and friends.
