CRAIG DUVALL CHRISTOPHER SANDERS was born to Ernest and Marie Carmen Sanders on December 8, 1957 in Baltimore, Maryland. He received his education in the Baltimore City Public School System and graduated from Northern High School in 1976. He also attended RETS Electronic School and received a certification in electrical wiring.

He was raised Catholic and later joined the Mt. Ararat Baptist Church where he married the “love of his life” – Cookie. They were married on December 8, 1990 – on his birthday – so he would never forget their anniversary!

Throughout their marriage, they had many nicknames for each other; the most recent one was “Moozie.” Cookie was with her “Moozie” until the time of his death and will never forget his peaceful departure on September 16, 2012.

No one could ever say that Craig did not enjoy his life, and he lived his life exactly the way he wanted. was employed by Lakeside Benefits until he was no longer able to work in the manner he wanted. His skills as a carpenter can be seen throughout many homes in the Baltimore Metropolitan area.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Marie Sanders-Wilson and Ernest Sanders.

Craig was a devoted husband, brother and true friend to anyone who needed help.
