CROSBY L. PARHAM, son of the late Lindwood and Carolyn Parham, was born on October 7, 1943 in New York, New York. He departed this life on January 3, 2012.

Crosby's early education was in Sussex County, Virginia where he attended elementary and junior high school. He lived there with his grandmother until 1958. He then came to Baltimore after the passing of his grandmother, Priscilla Parham to live with his aunt Mae Myers where he completed his education in the public schools of Baltimore, Maryland.

Crosby was drafted in the United States Armed Service in February of 1962 and served until April of 1965.

Crosby was a very friendly and easy going person who loved to converse, especially about his family and professional boxing. He was very well known in his neighborhood as a person willing to help any of them in need.

In 1974, Crosby met Sheila Willingham. They were joined in holy matrimony on September 11, 1986. From this union, one son was born, Jawann.

Crosby held numerous jobs, such as, working for Park Circle Chevy, City Water Bureau, Conrail and Amtrak Railway Systems from which he retired
