Curtis Maurice Miller affectionately known to his family and friends as “Brother” was born on June 4, 1955 to the late Curtis & Alice Miller in Baltimore, MD. Curtis departed this life suddenly on Monday, July 18, 2016 in the Intensive Care Unit of the Upper Chesapeake Hospital in Belair, MD. A life-long resident of Maryland, Curtis spent his adult life in Harford County (Edgewood), MD. Curtis was educated in the Baltimore City Public School and attended Mergenthaler Vocational Technical High School. It was early in his senior year that Curtis went to pursue his dreams of being a Marine. Curtis enlisted in the United States Marine Corps on February 14, 1974.

In the Marine Corps, Curtis served his country honorably and earned recognition as a Sharp Shooter, and received the National Defense Medal. Curtis departed from the military in 1976 with the rank of Lance Corporal.
