June 26, 1963 - February 6, 2017

Curtis Lee Anthony Salters, son of Henry D. Salters II and Marcias Squires Reinhold, was born on June 26, 1963 in Manhattan, New York. He departed this life peacefully in his sleep, while holding his wife's hand, on February 6, 2017 after a lengthy battle with injuries and traumas suffered in the military. He received his education at West High School in Anchorage, Alaska and some college where he studied law. Curtis enlisted in the United States Marine Corps in September 1981. He received numerous awards and medals and was honorably discharged in September 1984. After leaving the military he worked for the IRS and the US Postal Service.

Curtis was blessed to have three beautiful children: Jamecia, Cole and Kyniya.

In 1997 he met the love of his life, a US Marine, his best friend and soul mate, Robin E. Jenkins. He proposed on Valentine's Day in 2013 and the two united in marriage on October 11, 2013. They were inseparable. Their love was not about finding perfection in one another but instead being flexible, patient, and showing love and gratitude in thoughtful ways. They dreamed of opening up a Bed and Breakfast in New York one day. He constantly left messages for her to "Dream Big" and to never give up on their dreams. Believe that all things were possible, if she'd just "Believe".

He was an avid pet lover and cared for the environment. He loved his cats: Spunky, Sky, Snowball and Cotton. He raised two cockatiels: Chewy and Joker. He recycled and his hobbies included organic gardening, singing opera

and contemporary and jazz dance. He loved law inspired shows and was always searching for the latest information in health and fitness. He constantly had his wife cook meals from ingredients and spices mentioned on Dr. Oz. He was a very compassionate person and oftentimes put others needs before his own. Curtis and Robin often entertained guests during Sunday Brunch. The late Margaret Klain was a regular guest for over 20 years until she passed at 101 years old. Another Sunday brunch guest was Lillian Holley until medical issues stopped her from attending. He called her often and was making plans to visit our 96 year old friend although both he and she were housebound.

A tradition of Sunday Brunch was Robin's way of making him feel as if he was dining in a fine restaurant. Every Sunday the place setting, décor and meal were different. Since he ate cereal and plain yogurt during the week, he really looked forward to beautiful gourmet inspired Sunday Brunch. He worried about her daily and if she didn't call to let him know she was safe at work, he would call every co-worker and department in the USPS until he was certain she arrived safely.

He leaves to cherish his memory: His devoted wife, Robin E. Jenkins-Salters; one son, Cole X. Salters; two daughters Jamecia Salters and Kyniya Salters; one grandson, Santos; father, Henry D.
