CYNTHIA PATRICIA NANTON, oldest of five children of Daisy Cynthia Nanton and the late James Cray Nanton, was born on November 5, 1941 In Montserrat, British West Indies. She received her early education in the British West Indies.

At the age of 17, Cynthia moved to New York City. There she completed her higher education and, upon graduation, assumed the position as a registered nurse at Montifiore Hospital. Later, she held nursing positions at Mt. Sinai and St Luke's Hospital, both in New York. She relocated to Hartford, Connecticut where she became a part of the medical staff at Hartford Hospital. She retired from her profession after having risen to an administrative position in ConnectiCare, a healthcare agency in Hartford.

In 2006, Patty, as she was fondly known, moved to Baltimore to be near her family. An extremely caring and outgoing individual, she made new friends while maintaining her many long-term relationships. She was supportive and encouraging, and, as such, she enriched the lives of those with whom she came in contact with her cheery, upbeat personality. "Surprise" gifts of fresh, personally arranged floral bouquets were her signature gesture!

Patty was introduced to Christ through the Catholic Church. She chose, however, to become a member of Providence Baptist Church after moving to

Baltimore. Within this segment of the Body of Christ, she committed herself to a life filled with worship, fellowship, discipleship and ministry. She attended worship services and prayer meetings; she affiliated herself with church auxiliaries; she studied in Sunday classes and enjoyed serving others whenever requests came. She entrenched herself in the fabric of Providence Baptist. The membership benefitted from her baking skills for special occasions. Her famous pound cakes and "Seven Layer Cookies" were always received with great joy! Additionally, the youth of Providence never hesitated to make special requests for Sister Patty's involvement in their activities. She faithfully supported The Marcus Garvey Wood Parent Child Exchange. She became an active member of the Floral Club, the Combined Choir, the Women's Chorus and "The Experienced", an adult liturgical dance ensemble. At one time, she volunteered as an assistant at the Providence Adult Daycare Center.

Cynthia Patricia Nanton had an affinity for the color red, decorative mice, magnets, flowers and plants. She enjoyed attending plays and watching movies. She also travelled extensively throughout Europe and the Caribbean.

Patty never failed to request prayer for others and for herself. She relished the comfort that came to her from the reading of scripture. Her faith sustained her during her illness and she pleased others with her patient demeanor and her great concern for others. On January 6, 2016, she quietly transitioned to Eternal Rest.
