She was born in Baltimore, MD on March 13, 1920, to the late Samuel Taylor and Florence Lammon. 6. The Neighborhood Community “30th Street” area plan to name the neighborhood park in her honor.
7. She was a faithful member of the Elks and Reindeer Rest Auxiliaries.
8. She was a member of the Silver Eagles at Israel Baptist Church.

Daisy was a loving person who enjoyed opening her home for social gatherings for all. She was a source of joy for all who knew her and spent time with her. She provided a warm, hospitable, welcoming, and loving home.
