Damon Antonio Johnson, affectionately known as Blg Fruit, was born July 6, 1975, in Baltimore, Maryland, to the late Harvey A. Johnson and Diane Johnson (Nixon). He peacefully departed this life on September 8, 2025.

Damon was educated in both Baltimore City Public Schools and Private Schools. He spent much of his youth on the youth on the Basketball court, winning trophies and leading his team to many victories during his high school years. Damon was known for his wit and humor. His mother fondly recalled when he once told her he didn't like Catholic school when asked why, he replied, "I don't like the nuns", she asked "How many nuns do you know? Beyond playing, Damon loved to debate sports with his uncles, friends, and especially his Uncle George, with whom he shared a close bond.
