DAVID E. FLEMING JR, son of the late David and Dorothy Fleming, was born on August 6, 1931 in Baltimore, Maryland. He is preceded in death by two brothers, John and Joseph Fleming. He departed this life on October 25, 2008. He received his education in Baltimore public schools. At the age of nineteen he enlisted in the United States Marine Corps.
