David Lee Alston, son of the late Willis and Mildred Alston, was born on October 28, 1942 in Baltimore, Maryland. He departed this life on May 14, 2005, after a lengthy illness. He received his education at Dunbar High School. At the age of eighteen he went into the United States Army, where he became a Parachute Trooper, an expert in 106 mm r.r. and a sharpshooter. He was also a member of the Gospel singing group called the "Rejoices," which he loved very much. He was a member of 555th Parachute Infantry Assn., Inc. (Triple Nickles), the world's first Black Paratroopers. He was employed with the Mass Transit Administration as a bus driver for 27 years until his health led him to retirement in 1987. He met and married Charity Franklin in 1959 and out of this union one son was born, Anthony Alston, Sr. He later met and married Cleopatra Pullen in 1968, out of this union two daughters were born, Dawn and Diane Alston. David was a devoted father to his children always making sure they never wanted for anything. For those who knew him he was the life of the party and a true friend to everyone he knew. He leaves to mourn: one son, Anthony Alston, Sr.; two daughters, Dawn and Diane Alston; three grandchildren, Latarsha Austin, Anthony Alston, Jr. and D'Aaliyah Nicole Vaughan; four great grandchildren; one sister, Delceno Jackson; three aunts, Jennie Burgess, Lessie Johnson and Mildred Alston; devoted brother-in-law, Charles Shivers; nieces, nephews, cousins, a companion, the family's pet, Rokie; and a dear friend, his ex-wife, Cleopatra Alston.
