DAWUD ABDULLAH SHARIF II was born January 31, 1948 (David C. Winborne) to the late Dawud A. and Mable B. Sharif in Virginia. He returned to Allah on March 22, 2012, after an extended illness.

Through parental ties he accepted Islam in June of 1954, under the leadership of the Honorable Elijah Muhammad.

Dawud received his early education in Baltimore City Public Schools and graduated from Edmonson High School in 1966 (one of the largest classes in Maryland). He later attended Coppin State. While furthering his education he worked at Armco Steel, Bethlehem Steel, Proctor and Gamble and Yellow Transportation Company until he became ill, preventing him from further employment.

“Dude” as he was often called was a very spiritual and loving man with a charismatic personality that drew people to him. His warm personality coupled with his vast knowledge of an array of subjects allowed him to connect with many people. He will be missed by all the lives he touched. A devoted father and grandfather, wonderful friend, caring neighbor, devout Muslim, are just a few ways to describe him. His quick wit and talent for relating to people makes him an unforgettable person. He leaves us all with a lifetime of incredible memories to cherish and that we are thankful for.

Dawud met and married Jacqueline Washington and from this union two children were born, Jacquetta Darminia Sharif and Dawud Abdullah Sharif. In later years, “Dude” met Lois McLaughlin, a loving companion for over 25 years. He was preceded in death by his younger brother Osman Sharif.
