Dazarie Jacquelin Curtis was the only child born to Estelle Curtis and Harry Richardson on March 2, 1930.

Dazarie grew up in the infamous Jackson Ward community and was educated in the Richmond Public School system. She loved the Lord and received Christ at an early age and joined Cedar Street Baptist Church. She later became a member of Thirty-first Street Baptist Church under the leadership of Rev. William M. Davis. While there, she helped prepare meals for the church's soup kitchen.

Dazarie was employed by Sally Bell's Kitchen for 32 years where she worked with her mother who retired after 60 years of service. Dazarie was known as the neighborhood "Mama." Her heart was opened to helping others, her home to sheltering those in need and her kitchen to feeding those who were hungry. Mama had a passion and gift of cooking and sewing second only to her love of shoes. She made garments for neighbors, friends and the church choir. Her cooking was so well known that she had many socials back in the day so that she could sell her meals to the many who desired them.

Mama was preceded in death by her parents, Estelle Curtis and Harry Richardson; a granddaughter, Irecia Morris.

She leaves to celebrate her life and cherish her memory, four daughters; Yvonne T. Jones (John), Charlene D. Jefferson (Percell), Shelia T. Waller and Mary L. Greene (Earnest); five sons; Charles S. Thompson, Jr. (Annette), Cornelius I. Thompson, Willie M. Thompson (Shirley), Jonathan J. Thompson (caregiver) and William E.
