DEBBIE MARIE ALLEN, daughter of Naomi Williams and the late William Jackson, was born on June 13, 1959, in New York. She departed this life on November 13, 2013 from a lengthy battle with cancer.

She graduated from West Catholic High in Philadelphia in 1977 and attended Alvernia College and Harcum Junior College. After successfully completing paralegal courses, she pursued work in a law office. She enlisted in the U. S. Army in December of 1985 and began working for the National Security Agency (NSA) in 1988. While working for the NSA, she received many recognitions and certificates for her outstanding achievements. She retired from the Army in 2008 and later retired from the NSA in June 2013.

Debbie was involved in many organizations and volunteer groups within the community. She was a long-time contributor to the Reginald F. Lewis Museum and enjoyed traveling and music. Debbie was an active member of St. Stephens A.M. E. Church, where she served as a co-chair of the trustee board and various ministries within the church.

Debbie moved to Baltimore in 1991, made numerous friends wherever she went and will be sincerely missed by everyone who knew her. She was always a true friend and was highly devoted to her family.

She leaves to mourn: her son, Andre Allen; her mother, Naomi Williams; a twin sister, Darlene Allen-Jackson; two brothers, Darrell Allen and Alfred Abrams, nieces, nephews, and a host of other relatives and friends.

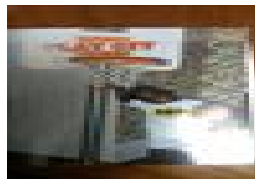
