Deborah loved her boys, and in 1998 moved her family to Henderson, North Carolina. Deborah was proud of her boys and made sure that they had a loving home. She raised them to be courageous young men, willing to take responsibility for their lives. However, as her illness progressed, Deborah moved back to Baltimore to be near family and friends. Deborah gave her life to Christ at the age of five. She was very passionate about her relationship with the Father, and it was her faith and indomitable spirit that kept her strong in her battle against her illnesses to the very end. Deborah was fun loving and loved to travel and cook. She made wonderful dishes and was always experimenting with and concocting new recipes. She was warm and funny; she loved laughter, was excited about life and living, and found joy

in Christ, her boys and her home. She had wisdom and insight that belied her forty-nine years of living.
