She departed this life after a serious illness on February 5, 2018. Deborah received her education in the Baltimore City Public Schools, graduating from Forest Park Senior High School, Debbie attended one year of college at the Community College of Baltimore, majoring in Accounting.

Deborah loved her children and her grandchildren, Da'mon and Markus and her family. She had many friends and was a jovial person. She was a good dancer and liked having fun. She like playing games. She loved the movie "The Five Heartbeats" and watched it many times. She also loved playing "Candy Crush". When talking to friends on the telephone she rarely spoke but you could hear laughing frequently.

Her husband, "Bernard", was very devoted and loving caregiver after her first stroke. He became her primary caregiver after she came home from the hospital. Many people remarked on how well he took care of Debbie. He was later assisted by Ms. Denise Coles who provided excellent care to Debbie.
