Delores was very special and always showed that in the hearts of many. She loved giving. In fact, she created her own Christmas Holiday in January. On Christmas Day everyone enjoyed being with their families, but Delores wanted more. She made January her Christmas Day and ensued that every grandchild and her children would receive a gift personally from her on January's Christmas.

She loved other children so much that she watched her co-workers children, neighborhood kids and anyone else who needed help. She extended her helping hand to everyone.

Delores personality can be described as strong-willed, determined, loving caring and very dependable.

Mamma confessed her life to Christ in the mid 1970's with the Seventh Day Adventist Church and rededication he life with the Berean Baptist Church earlier this year. She loved to read scriptures, listen to gospel music and have words of prayer.
