Dee enjoyed traveling the country with her husband and they enjoyed simply being together in their home. She loved and adored their family and people in general. Dee presented herself to be friendly therefore folk from all walks of life were drawn to that beautiful smile and charming personality.

A Time to Serve

Delores was raised in the Catholic faith, but in 1982 she was baptized at Rising Mount Zion Baptist Church, under the pastorate of Dr. Leroy M. Bray, Jr. Delores was ordained as a Deacon on April 13, 1997. She loved to help others and served as Director of Missions at RMZ for six years. She also served as a Hospice volunteer, Meals on Wheels, Emergency Shelter and Caritas-setting up programs to feed and house the homeless. In addition to the many other organizations, she worked with Second Chance, an organization that houses Aids victims. Although she had health issues, each year she generously donated to others who needed a helping hand, often unanimously. Deacon Northington loved studying the Bible. She served as a Church School Teacher, taught classes on Women in the Bible. She never lost her excitement about learning more about the Lord and demonstrated that she truly loved Him. Delores belonged to numerous civic organizations, always dedicated to helping others, such as Les Dix Madames of Philadelphia, PA, and American Business Women Association (ABWA) of Richmond, VA, both organizations sponsored scholarships for deserving students.
