Dr. Demark McCloud, age 83, of Ellicott City, Maryland, peacefully departed this life on June 7, 2026. He was born on May 19, 1943, in Winston-Salem, North Carolina, to the late Booker T. McCloud and Castello McCloud.

Known for his determination, creativity, and accommodating spirit, Dr. McCloud was a man who placed family at the center of his life. He was a devoted husband and father whose presence reflected strength, care, and unwavering support. He encouraged excellence and resilience in those he loved, instilling values that will continue to shape generations.

He found great joy in gardening and took immense pride in maintaining an immaculate lawn that became well known throughout the community. Neighbors and friends admired not only the beauty of his work, but also the dedication behind it. He often shared words of wisdom that reflected his outlook on life, reminding others that, "It is not your aptitude, but your attitude, that determines your altitude."
