



Denise Darcel Wynn-Boyd

November 26, 1957 - January 13, 2018

On Saturday, January 13, 2018, God in His infinite wisdom called His beloved daughter, Denise D. Wynn Boyd to her heavenly home. She was born in Brooklyn, New York, November 26, 1957 to the late John Scott and Lurine Calvin. Her formative years began in Brooklyn and later resided in Queens, New York with who she affectionately knew as her "second mother", Lois Alexander. At the age of 14, Denise embarked upon her boundless spiritual journey. She gave her life to Christ and accepted Him and declared Him as her Lord and Savior! She worshiped at Christ Pentecostal Temple in Queens, New York.

She was preceded in death by her father John Oliver Scott, step-father Morris Wright, step-father Clifford Alexander, mother-in-law Evelyn Gibson, two brothers Anthony Scott and Marvin Calvin, three aunts Hallie Burgess, Gussie Mae Johnson, and Ethel Womble (Will).

Living in Brooklyn, New York she attended Public School P.S. 73. Upon moving to Queens, she attended Public-School 45, and Stephen A. Halsey Jr. High. Denise was a member of the Forrest Hills High School Graduating Class of 1974. From an early age, she had a high value of education and a heartfelt respect for educators. This was evidenced in her commitment to being a "life learner". Denise attended Medgar Evers College in Brooklyn, New York where she earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Elementary Education. She went on

to earn a Master of Science Degree from City University of New York in Early Childhood School Education. Given her strong desire to broaden her impact as an educator, Denise also earned The Graduate Certificate of Completion in Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL) from Grand Canyon University in Phoenix, Arizona. She also received, certifications in Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics (STEM) from Columbia University in New York. Most recently, Denise matriculated at Liberty University School of Divinity; pursuing a Doctor of Ministry (D.Min.) in Evangelism.

Denise married Terry Jerome Wynn, who predeceased her in 2002. From this union, one daughter, Darcelle Olivia Wynn was born. For several years, Denise taught kindergarten at Alpha Kappa Alpha Daycare Center. Darcelle was afforded the opportunity to be daughter and student. Darcelle was required to acknowledge her mother as "Mrs. Wynn" along with the rest of her classmates.

Beginning a new chapter in her life, Denise moved to the Bronx and began a career as an Intervention Coordinator at Narco Freedom, Inc. She touched lives of persons in substance abuse recovery, childhood trauma and those impacted by cognitive behavioral issues. Returning to her first love as an educator; Denise began teaching third-grade at P.S. 153 Adam Clayton Powell; where she remained for over a decade.

Denise, affectionately known as Sweetums, Nicey, Aunt Nee-Nee, Grandma Boyd and Winnie Poo, took her work very seriously; however, she enjoyed life to the fullest! Her free time was filled with playing a game of "Spades", listening to classical music, and reviving the diminished art of crocheting! The game "Words with Friends" brought three of Denise's favorite pastimes together: building words, spending time with friends, and having fun! She also enjoyed the arts and theater. The Lion King was her favorite. Denise loved

children! Sowing love and compassion into those she met, permitted her anointed connection to soothe the most unruly child; in the classroom or on the street. She loved to cook for her family and watch her favorite TV shows. Denise often became quite annoyed when Charles and Darcelle would have a conversation during the most interesting scene of the show. The only thing bigger than her heart was her laugh. Her laugh came from a place of abundant love and divine happiness. Her gracious spirit coupled with the vibrant attire she wore allowed those who met her only once, appreciate how unique she was.

During the Spring of 2007, the Lord led Denise to travel from New York to Ashland, VA to attend the Calvary Pentecostal Tabernacle Camp Meeting. It was during this retreat that Denise and Charles L. Boyd, Sr. were introduced. They were joined in Holy Matrimony July 31, 2010. Denise became mother to Khalid R. and Charles L. Boyd, Jr. In 2013, Denise left New York and moved to Richmond. She joined her husband at Mt. Gilead Full Gospel International Ministries; under the spiritual leadership of Bishop Daniel Robertson and Co-Pastor Elena Roberson. Denise soon "plugged-in" and became involved in the Helps Ministries at Mt. Gilead; Power Packers Children's Ministry, Intercessory Prayer, Special Forces, and Prison Ministry. During any given Sunday morning or Wednesday evening service, The Boyd's - often with coordinating attire, would be at the altar, dancing, praising and worshipping God!

During the morning of Saturday, January 13th, Denise very willingly answered the call of her wise and loving God! She continued her dance into her peaceful, eternal rest; with her devoted Man of God, Mr. Charles L. Boyd, Sr., by her side.

In addition to her husband, Denise leaves to cherish her memory two sons, Khalid R. and Charles L. Boyd, Jr.; one daughter, Darcelle O. Wynn; four
