Deondre Anthony Gilliam, son of Stacey Lee Mouzon and the late Robert Anthony Gilliam, was born on June 24, 1993 in Baltimore, Maryland. He departed this life unexpectedly on April 8, 2021.

He received his formal education in Baltimore and graduated from Overlea High school. He was able to give his mother 3 years as a student at BCCC. Deondre was the oldest of seven siblings. He grew up in Baltimore where he remained throughout his life. Deondre had a remarkably close relationship growing up, with his Great Aunt, April Jones and his sister-cousin, Marie and brother-cousin, DJ. At the request of Deondre's dad at an early age, Arthur Harris was designated to care for him. This proved to be a lasting personal bond between Deondre and Arthur. which could be seen as intimidating, Deondre was more like a giant teddy bear. He was the epitome of if looks can be deceiving. NOT taking anything from his innate protective nature, Deondre represented himself as the Bigga one, the one to whom you could turn to in times of need. Never one to back down from a challenge, Deondre was very assertive and at times seemingly aggressive. This was Deondre, the protector. His smile was contagious as he possessed a grin that was pretty much hypnotizing. Travelling had become a love for Deondre. He shared that newly found passion with the love of his life, Amalia. As the oldest child of seven, Deondre was the "Bigga Brotha" of 6nl (Dee, Mikey, Bop, Na Na, Be Be, Mina Mina, and Man Man), the lovingly lasting name given to the siblings by his one and only sister, Imani. Overall, he owned his position as the oldest and demanded the respect of his brothers and sisters. Sometimes he got it, sometimes he had to fight for especially with "Na Na". Sibling rivalry existed amongst them all, but at the heart of it, love prevailed.
