Dixon Stokes was born to the late James and Mary Ellen Stokes on October 4, 1935, in Baltimore, Maryland. He departed this life on January 14, 2023, after a brief illness.

Dixon was educated in the Baltimore City Public School System, graduating from Paul Laurence Dunbar High School.

Dixon was employed at numerous medical facilities over the years starting out as an orderly and working his way up to a sterile processing technician. He worked at several hospitals including Maryland General, Bon Secures and Liberty Medical Center. He retired in 2005.

At a young age Dixon began singing and playing drums. For more than 30 years he was an active member of the "The Honey Boys," a local band. They performed in and around Baltimore and occasionally in New Jersey. The band recorded two songs, "Unchanged Melody" and "Honey Love."

In February 1961 he married his wife Phyllis Cunningham of Baltimore. From their union they had four children. They remained married until her death in January 2011.

Dixon was a quiet spirit who loved music. He loved to sing and even write

music. He enjoyed spending time with his family and friends. Even when he wasn't playing, he had his drumsticks.

Dixon was a member of Triumph Church of God in Baltimore, for more than four years. He was active in the church and loved by all. On Sundays, you would always find him behind the drums.

Dixon made friends easily and will be sincerely missed by all who knew him.
