DJ Ward, son of the late William and Mary Ward, was born on June 24, 1918 in Charbourn, North Carolina. God called him home peacefully on Thursday, August 21, 2003 at 3:45 p.m. after a lengthy illness. He received his education in the public school system in North Carolina. He joined St. Stephen's in his early teens, where he accepted Christ. DJ married Lula Catherine Carrie on October 12, 1941, then relocated in 1954 to Baltimore, Maryland, where he continued his life. He was the father of the late William Ward, who lived in New York City with his family in April of 1953 he joined, became a member and serves as a Junior Deacon of the Most Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge Trinity 75 (PHA). DJ retired from JL Clark Manufacturing Company at the age of 65 in May 1983. He believed in strong family values. He was a father figure to most family members and friends and believed in doing everything on time, whenever you needed him, he was always there, until he became ill.
