December 19, 1903 - January 4, 2003

Dollie Dorothy Goldsborough was born in Baltimore, Maryland where she resided for 99 years. On January 4, 2003, Heaven opened its gates and welcomed Dollie into the Kingdom. While having this earthy experience, she married James Albert Goldsborough in 1928. She was the mother of twelve children. From the twelve children, she became the grandmother of twenty-three grandchildren, thirty-one great grandchildren, and three great-great grandchildren. Dollie was outgoing, hospitable and very active in community activities. In her early years, she was a member of the Jolly Matrons, the Aisquith and Sapp Streets Neighborhood Association, and Just Us Six social clubs. She loved traveling, pretty dresses and socializing with family and friends. She was a lady with a quiet spirit but she spoke her mind if she cared for you. "Among" her many talents, she was a great cook who was known for her bread and rice puddings. But she was known to have cooked some real special dishes and if you happened to have stopped at her home, you probably left with the impression that it was done especially for you. She accepted Jesus Christ as her personal savior at an early age and was baptized in 1927 at Unity Baptist Church. She became a member of New Life Missionary Baptist Church in 1973 under the pastorship of Rev. Maxwell Johnson. Aunt Dollie, as she was affectionately known, was loved and received by the New Life family. She was a member of the Deaconess Board,

the Missionaries; named Mother of the Year in 1978 and later named the Mother of the Church. She leaves to celebrate her life: four sons, Leon, Allen, Ellsworth, and Andrew; five daughters, Doris, Wilhelmina, Ann, Theresa and Mary Ellen; one daughter-in-law, Shirley; one son-in-law, William Lee Foster, Sr., twenty-three grandchildren, thirty-one great-grandchildren, three great-great grandchildren and a host of other relatives and friends.
