Donald Bell Wallace was born in Baltimore, Maryland. He was the youngest of three sons born to the union of Thomas and Lillian Wallace. Upon completion of his military assignment in Germany, Donald was awarded the Medal of Good Conduct, Occupation Medal and the National Defense Service Medal or Honors. He had a passion and great love for children, which was demonstrated during two years of volunteer tutoring for students at Bethel Christian School. During his long career as an educator, he received various awards. Among his achievements in the education realm, Donald received the Certificate of Merit for Faithful Years of Service. After retiring, Donald spent long hours enjoying his first love of reading the scriptures. His favorite place in God's Word was the Psalms, especially Psalms 1, Psalms 23 and Psalms 91.
