

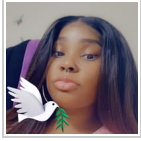


Donald H. Sanders

Rev. Donald M. Sanders, Sr., son of the late Bishop Eddie Sanders and Rev. Al H. Sanders, was born on November 5, 1938 in Savannah, Georgia. He departed this life on September 25, 2002 after a lengthy illness. He received his education from Camden High School in Camden South Carolina. He attended Georgia Tech University from 1954-1956 where he received his degree in welding. Upon completion of his education, he became a full-time employee at Ed Moore Roofing and Tarring Co. he worked at Bethlehem Steel as plant manager, Pepsi Cola as district manger, and heave equipment operator in Youngstown, Ohio. He also worked for Abacus Corp. as Department Head for twenty-five years. In November 1994, he started his own business, Dacapo Floor Care until present. He was a member of Antioch Memorial Baptist Church. He was a licensed Minister of the Household of Faith church from 1989-1994. He was also a thirty-third degree Mason. He leaves to mourn: his wife, Juanita B. Sanders; two sons, Donald M. Sanders II and Ben Allen; three daughters, Vivian Deaver, Cynthia Sanders and Princess Sanders; nine grandchildren three great-grandchildren and a host of other relatives and friends.
