Donald received his formal education in the Baltimore City Public School, graduating from Baltimore City College High School in 1971. He excelled in math and science. Donald was also an outstanding athlete in football.

He began his spiritual training at age ten and gave his life to Christ at age fifteen. He attended the Ebenezer Baptist Church under pastor Rev. Maxwell Johnson.

Donald was united in Holy Matrimony on March 27, 2009 to Marsha Elena Grant.

He began his career at Johns Hopkins Hospital as a Pharmacy Technician. But he continued to pursue his dream as a Paramedic at the Baltimore City Fire Department graduating from the Fire Academy in January of 1978. After leaving the fire department he started a new career for the Maryland State

Department of Juvenile Justice as a transportation officer. Later he continued his passion in health with a job at East Coast Ambulance Company until he became ill and unable to continue working.

Donald loved being with his family and most of all loved sharing his wisdom with his nieces and nephews.

Donald E. Mack Jr. went home to be with Jesus, his parents and brothers Willard and Avon Mack Sr. who preceded him in death.
