Innate musical genes ran in his family with his father Roy "Tanglefoot" McCoy (trumpet) and his brother Roy Jr. (drums). Donald began playing the drums early in life. For years, he was the drummer in The Whatnauts Band, popular in Baltimore in the 70's and 80's. He would say, "Wow, they pay me for doing what I love!" It was one of his events in Baltimore that he met Wanda Lee when they were in their late teens. God was benevolent and kept their paths crossing amicably, again and again, until they married in 2002.

Donald often told the story of his birth; in a cab on the way to the hospital. Perhaps he was in a hurry to get here. Or perhaps it was the car engine that inspired him, for he came to love driving. He became a truck driver early in life, driving anything from 18-wheelers up and down the east coast to dump trucks for various companies in Baltimore. For a period of time, he worked as a truck driver for Maryland's Department of General Services, followed by driving trucks for Maryland Environmental Services.

Until this summer, he was an Uber driver. Donald really loved meeting people from all over the world and asking them questions about where they lived. He

always said he never met a person he couldn't learn from. He had a natural ability to bring a smile to the face of most people as shown by many favorable remarks he received in his customers' ratings and comments.

He was previously married to Rhonda Macer and from this union a daughter, Corefa, was born.

He is preceded in death by his parents, his grandmother Hanna McCoy, his brother Roy Jr. and his sister Ernestine Lecator.
