Donna Rene (Lowry) Knight peacefully departed this life for eternal rest on Sunday, October 8, 2017 while in her Father's House of worship. At the appointed time, the Father saw that she was ready, and sent His angels to bring her home.

Donna was born in Baltimore, Maryland on December 21, 1962, the oldest of four children to the blessed union of Magnolia Cannon Lowry (deceased) and Donald Lowry, Jr.

She attended Baltimore City Public Schools, including Western High School where she received a diploma in 1980. She went on to graduate from Towson University in 1989 with a bachelor's degree in Business Administration.

In May 1981, Donna gave birth to a beautiful baby girl, Ava' Roberts. She was very proud of Ava's academic and career accomplishments. Following in her mother's footsteps, Ava' graduated from Western High School, and is now a senior microbiologist at Johns Hopkins Hospital.

For nearly 21 years, Donna worked at the United States Geological Survey (USGS), starting in the student program but eventually advancing and becoming part of the organization's Publications Unit. She was a valued employee at USGS, winning several awards acclaiming her hard work and

dedication. Oftentimes, Donna served as a mentor for newer colleagues, teaching them how to excel in and navigate within the organization.

In 2007, she moved to the United States Department of Justice (DOJ), U.S. Attorney's Office where she worked as a legal assistant. She was well-loved and respected by her colleagues at DOJ. They will miss seeing her walking the corridors, greeting every person along the way.

Donna was passionate about workplace diversity. At both USGS and DOJ she actively engaged in committees with the goal of increasing opportunities and access to all workers. She was also a lifelong participant in the Federally Employed Women's group, gaining recognition throughout the years and winning scholarships to participate in conferences. She was also actively involved in the Blacks in Government group.

On August 5, 1992, Donna met the love of her life, Gerald, during their blind date. The two were introduced by Gerald's co-worker and Donna's friend, and spent the three months prior to their first date talking on the phone. From their very first date, Gerald knew that Donna would be his wife. He popped the question while they were looking at rings in a jewelry store. On the third anniversary of that first date, August 5, 1995, their union was made official before God, family and close friends.

Donna had unwavering faith in God, and strongly believed in Christian teachings. She was a dedicated member at Timothy Baptist Church and Gospel Tabernacle Baptist Church, where she was active on many different committees. Later she joined and worshipped with Friendship Baptist Church, where she participated in plays and coordinated mentoring and scholarship programs for youth. She was also a member of the Baltimore area Red Hat Society, where she enjoyed dressing up and wearing flashy hats to the group's events.

Donna's memory will be forever cherished by her husband, Gerald Knight; daughter Ava' Roberts; father Donald Lowry, Jr.; grandmother Margaret Lowry; sister Danita Hampton; brother Donald Lowry, III; brother DaWayne Lowry; aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews, and a host of other family and beloved friends.
