Doretha King, daughter of the late Roger and Martha Mills, was born May 1, 1921 in Nashville, North Carolina. She departed this life Thursday, June 2, 2005 after a short illness. She was educated in Zebulon, North Carolina, Wakefield High School. She confessed at an early age at Zebulon Baptist Church. Her family moved to Baltimore, Maryland where she became a member at New Pilgrim Baptist Church and sang on the choir. She later became a member of Ray of Hope Baptist Church. Doretha joined the Church Wide Sick Committee and served on the committee until her untimely death. Doretha loved her church and church family at Ray of Hope. On May 1, 2005, she was surprised when they honored her 84th birthday and had her to stand. That made her very happy. Doretha's heart grew weaker in the last few months, but she continued to come to church until a few weeks ago. Doretha was also a member of the American Legion Auxiliary Post 285. She was employed at several companies to include City Hospital and Sears Roebuck and Company. Doretha met and married James King, Sr. in 1950. His death preceded hers 21 years ago. Doretha was blessed to raise two sons, one of whom preceded her in death, Rodney King. Blocker and Christine Hall, both of Columbia, Maryland; and many relatives and friends.
