If it was within her means to help you through a situation, what was hers was yours. You may have heard her say at any given time, "As long as my frig and cupboard are full, I'm happy!" Meaning she was able to offer her assistance. The Encourager in her would say, "I am not able to do or know your lessons, but I can sit here and turn the pages with you as you learn your lessons."

Mom's joys were simple but pleasurable, her family first, then sitting with the "Golden Girls" on the front step, going to her crochet classes at the Waxter Center, meeting with the Bibleway Seniors and navigating from the front passenger seat in whoever's car she found herself traveling with on any given day. Riding a horse, flying in a plane, and taking a ride on a motorcycle had always been a dream of hers. She expressed just the other day that her children made it possible for her to fulfill all her dreams.
