She was the fun Aunt who never beat you but her kindness made you listen. Coming from a large family she loved to be around children even to the end enjoying and making her great-great nieces and nephews laugh.

In 1977 after being faithful over all the children's lives that God had entrusted her with the Lord blessed her with a child of her own, Francisco Steven Carreras, Sr., who she loved dearly and was very proud of him. Especially when he completed school and became a firefighter. When her son married and gave her four grandchildren she was overwhelmed with joy.

Fotsie worked at University of Maryland Medical school department of Housekeeping for 35 years. She took pride in her work and would often say

the floors she was assigned to clean were the cleanest floors in the building. Even receiving certificates and acknowledgment from administration of what an outstanding job she did. Once finding a wallet and returning it to the owner untouched (Ben and Sulan Wu) who became her friends for life treating her with much kindness and taking care of her. Fotsie was able to make a friend wherever she went. She loved visiting Lexington Market before going to work and befriending all the merchants. All of them knew her by name. She loved her neighbors and knew them, their children and their children all by name. She got enjoyed going to Family Dollar and could find unique gifts to give to family and friends. You could expect a rather non tradition wrapped box with MANY, MANY THINGS IN IT.

Doris gave her life to Jesus Christ around 15 years of age at the First Apostolic Faith Church, and was baptized in Jesus Name under the leadership of the late Great Bishop Winfield Showell. Proclaiming her life long membership and tarrying for the Holy Ghost in the old Church. She loved coming to services and any of the events that they might have at Church under Bishop Cornelius and First Lady Augusta Showell. Always proclaiming her love for them and her church.
