She graduated from Armstrong High School when the eleventh grade was considered the senior year. For years she was a devoted and faithful member of the Mount Calvary Baptist Church and later joined the St. James Baptist Church as a "watch care" member where she continued to serve with faith and dedication. On December 23, 1939, she married Elijah Fields. This union was blessed with a son and two daughters. Even though she worked outside the home, she dedicated her life to raising her children. She gave of herself, her time, her energy and her service. During her life she was affiliated with the Ladies Auxiliary Board, the Rachel Fields Usher Board and the Hospitality Committee at St. James.
