Doris S. Harris, daughter of the late Elizabeth and William Savoy, was born on June 18, 1914 in Baltimore, Maryland. She departed this life on June 21, 2004 after a lengthy illness. She was educated in the Baltimore City Public School System, graduating from Douglass High School. She continued her education at the Provident Hospital School of Nursing, where she received her nursing degree. Doris was first employed by Provident Hospital, but continued her nursing career by working as a private duty nurse and as a nurse in the office of Dr. I. Bradshaw Higgins. She later worked as a public health nurse for the Baltimore City Health Department at Schools #182 and #183. She concluded her career at School #78, Harlem Park Junior High School.
