DORIS IRMA ROWLETT was born on April 11, 1924 at Johns Hopkins Hospital. She was the eleventh of twelve children born to the late Rev. John Samuel and Martha Rowlett. Doris received her education in the Baltimore City Public Schools and graduated from Paul Laurence Dunbar High School in 1944. As a youth, she accepted Christ as her personal Savior at the Fountain Baptist Church and was baptized by the late Rev. Dennis Barrow. During her younger years, Doris was an active and ardent member of Sunday School, Junior Missionaries, and Youth Choir. She later became a faithful and diligent Christian worker in Zebulun Tribe and the Senior Missionaries. Under the leadership of Rev. Dennis Barrow, the Courtesy Guild was organized in 1959, and Doris became the President. Her work experience included the ownership of a dry cleaning store on Milton and Luzerne Avenues. She later worked with the Oliver Community Center Senior Program, and for a period of three years, she was employed as a legal secretary for the late Tucker Dearing, Esq., until her retirement. In later years, she met and married Leslie Williams of North Carolina who preceded her in death. She peacefully departed this life on Friday, June 20, 2008 at the Keswick Multi-Care Center, after a lengthy illness. She was preceded in death by six brothers and four sisters. She leaves to cherish many fond memories: a loving and devoted sister, Elizabeth Colbert; a life-long friend, Florence Hargrove; a devoted goddaughter, Dora White and godson, Donte Woods; a cousin, Muriel West; and a host of nephews, nieces, other relatives, and friends.
