Born on June 17, 1908 in Haynesville, Virginia, her parents were the late Maud Blanche Johnson and William Spence. Dorothy was the fourth of six siblings, all of whom have preceded her in death. Her only daughter, Delores Butler Johnson also preceded her in death (1979) as did her devoted husband of almost fifty years, Harry Cooper (March, 2001). Receiving Christ as her Saviour at an early age, membership was established with Mulberry Baptist Church in Emmerton, Virginia. After relocating to Baltimore, Maryland membership was established with the Faith Baptist Church in 1940. The church is located at Bond Street and Ashland Avenue. Singing God's praises was one of Dorothy's favorite pastimes, wherein she became a member of the Gospel Chorus at Faith. Position held in this organization were financial secretary, treasurer and wardrobe supervisor. She served with great spiritual zeal. For many years up until her retirement, Dorothy was employed as a housekeeper for many prominent old Baltimore Bluebook "families." "Dot" or "Aunt Dot" as she was fondly known to family and friends, was always "at the top her game." Frank, candid, highly organized, neat, determined, loving and generous, she excelled at any task she undertook. Dorothy possessed a "no nonsense" and "cut to the chase" attitude that brought clarity and direction to situations. Having a great love for beautiful things was evident in her creativity in the areas of needlework,
