For fun and leisure, she occasionally spent time bowling and traveling to the casino with family and friends. Dot enjoyed sightseeing and visited Myrtle beach and Niagara Falls for vacation.

Dorothy was devoted to helping and caring for others and was dedicated to her relatives. She was the backbone of the family. She appreciated dancing, spending time with her great grandchildren Howard and Hadrian and listening to songs by Sam Cooke and Otis Redding. Dorothy was the epitome of strength, selflessness, a confidant and an anchor for many.

Her natural comedic personality would make anyone laugh under the most serious of occasions. She had a welcoming spirit that would light up a room.
