DOROTHY WARE HAYES was born July 5, 1921 in Goochland County, Virginia. She was the 8th child born to the late Charles and Luvinia Ware. She was raised in a Christian home and was baptized at Second Union Baptist Church at an early age. She was educated in the public school system of Virginia. Dorothy met and married the late James Hayes on November 21, 1945. They briefly resided in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania and then relocated to Baltimore, Maryland. Dorothy was employed in many jobs and attended the St. Paul School of Nursing and graduated with the class of February, 1949. She joined Cherry Hill Community Presbyterian Church on March 2, 1958 and served faithfully as a Deacon, President of the Deacon Board, Trustee, President of the Trustee Board, and Elder. She was a long time member of the Sanctuary Choir. On December 17, 1991, Dorothy was named Woman of the Year by the United Presbyterian Women. In 2001, she became an Acolyte under the leadership of Mrs. Mattie Harris and served until May 2005. Dorothy loved people and enjoyed traveling near and far, frequently talking about her many experiences. She also enjoyed preparing meals, baking cakes and entertaining friends. She had fond memories of inviting the Elders to her home for dinners and cookouts. She was well known in the community for her sewing abilities as she made most of her clothes and matching hats. She took great pride in all of her activities. She frequently referred to herself as a country girl as she loved to work in her garden. Most of the little children living on Bookert Drive referred to her as "Aunt Dot" and she loved them all. She

leaves to cherish her memory a host of extended family and friends.
