DOROTHY B. MARTIN-JOHNSON, the youngest daughter of Edgar Latimer and Pearl Clark, was born on Thursday, July 17, 1924.

Dot (as she was affectionately called) was reared in Asheville, North Carolina and was educated in the Asheville public school system. After completing high school Dot moved to Baltimore and married Willie Forrest Martin in 1940. She enrolled in the Apex Beauty Academy and passed the Maryland State Board of Cosmetology licensing exam. Dot owned and operated a beauty salon in her home for more than eight years. As the neighborhood's beautician, Dot evolved into the matriarch of Mulberry Street where all of the families and children loved and respected her wisdom and accomplishments as a woman of color. During the years that she served as president of the Mulberry Street Community Association, Dot obtained the approval of Mayor William Donald Schaefer for a donation of the money needed to build a children's playground. After receiving an offer to work in the Baltimore city Public School System, Dot worked there until her retirement.

In 1972 Dot met and married her second husband, Clifford M. Johnson, Sr., father of Bishop Clifford committed their lives to Christ early in their marriage and were members of Ebenezer Baptist Church. Dot and Clifford loved to dance and travel with her Flamingo social club which she belonged to for over thirty years.

Working tirelessly for the community, she was on the board of Bon Secours Hospital and the outreach program of Southwestern Police District.
