After graduating from high school, Douglas enlisted in the United States Army Reserve, and served honorably for seven years. Douglas' fondness for youth led him to become a life long Educator and provider of treatment services. In 1999, he began his teaching career with Richmond Public Schools at Thompson Middle School. In 2005, he transitioned to Petersburg Public Schools, Vernon Johns Junior High School, as a Special Education Administrator, and re-entered the classroom to educate students with exceptionalities. With great faith and persistence, Douglas created and became owner and director of New Haven Children Services, LLC. Phase one of his vision exists of a group home for flourishing young men located in Richmond, Virginia. His most recent endeavor included the second phase of services designed to provide home-based family planning and treatment. With fervent prayer and nurturing, his professional goals and endeavors were

divinely ordered to empower youth to become productive future leaders. Dedicated to further uplift the community with strength and fortitude, Douglas was a proud member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. While attending Virginia State University, Douglas met and fell in love with Leslie Bryant. They were united in holy matrimony on October 13, 1998. Blessed with the covenant of this union, three children were born; Douglas, Jr., Jordan and Lauren. Douglas was a loving and devoted husband and father. His family was his treasure that continually inspired and increased his steadfast efforts.
