Wrestling became Dwayne's passion while at Highland Springs High School. He led the wrestling team to the State Championship three times with the help of his team under the advisement of Coach Ward.

Once in the Finals, the Springer's won all Four Regional Championships. In 1979, Dwayne graduated and furthered his education at Lock Haven University on a full wrestling scholarship. There he earned his Bachelor of Science Degree in Health, Physical Education, and Recreation.

Dwayne was the Director of the Southside Boys and Girls Club at the tender age of 27. He was known as "Mr. B" to the children and staff, and Dwayne's motto was "Keeping Dreams and Dreamers Alive."

As a Director, he taught the children morals and instilled character in them that would last a lifetime. He had the respect of the children and their parents as well. Mr. B. emphasized that having a close relationship with the members was important.

He truly was the ultimate diehard Miami Dolphins fan. His Dolphin man cave was a Hall of Fame. He had an extensive collection of Miami Dolphins memorabilia including sculptures and artworks of dolphins. He was an avid collector of anything about dolphins. Dwayne's favorite number was "5". Another one of Dwayne's passion was erecting structures and remodeling homes. Based on those desires, he founded Southern Gentleman Contracting Restoration and Cleaning Services, where his motto was "Honesty is the ONLY policy."
