



Dwight R. Gibson Sr

April 8, 1963 - September 10, 2020

Dwight Gibson, Sr., fondly known by his middle name, Raynard, was born in Baltimore, MD on April 8, 1963 to the late William Gibson and Gloria (Jones) Gibson. Dwight was educated in the Baltimore City Public School system where he had the opportunity to attend Park Heights Street Academy, the first private black preparatory school in Baltimore City. Although Dwight left prior to graduating, he later received his GED and went on to Baltimore City Community College to take EMT classes and later became a Patient Care Technician.

As a young adult, Dwight was quite active in youth sports and coached both boys and girls sports teams. He loved to draw, write poetry and spoke often about writing a book someday. One of his pieces was featured in a poetry contest where it earned him the prize for first place.

Dwight worked various types of jobs throughout his life, from working as a Laborer with his brothers at Gibson Brothers Landscaping to his service as a Patient Technician at the University of Maryland Medical Center's Shock Trauma. His intentions genuinely were to be of help in whatever capacity he could. Dwight also devoted over two decades of service to the United States Armed Forces having served in the Army National Guard and the U.S. Army Reserves since 1982.

Dwight attended St. Cecelia's Catholic Church as a child, but as a teen made a more serious commitment of faith and became a member of Faith Tabernacle Pentecostal Church. In his later years, he moved his membership and despite his sporadic attendance, held on to his faith in God until his death. He believed that God's love was eternal and that all things would work out in the end.

Dwight was preceded in death by his wife, Mable. Left to cherish his memory are his four children: Dwight Jr., Sophia, Raeshawn and Devon as well as Jazaria and Derrick whom he cherishes as his own. He is also survived by his mother Gloria Gibson and seven siblings, Ethel, Charleen, William, Gia, Alvin, Lamont, and Araya and one like a brother, Darrell; nine grandchildren; Daniel, Dakari, Dalyn, Dakaya, Dejon, Aiden, Nalani, Nibenah and Na'Azah and a host of aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews, cousins and friends.
