Earl returned to work force at Maryland State Police Criminal Records-Central Repository. He was a member of MCEA Chapter No. 38 and at one time served as Vice President. Earl traveled to the annual MCEA Convention held in Ocean City, Maryland for four decades.

Earl accepted Christ at a young age and was baptized at the Southern Baptist Church under the leadership of the late Rev. James R. Grant and remained at

Southern until he relocated to Atlanta, Georgia over a decade ago. Earl was a dedicated worker and would volunteer to help any ministry, group or committee.

At Southern, Earl sang on the Senior Choir No. 2, held office of President at one time and sang on the SBC Mass Choir as well. He attended Bible classes, the Congress of Christian Education Classes, Church-wide Institutes; he was Men's day Chairperson and a member of the 50th Golden Jubilee Yearbook Committee.

Earl loved to sing so he joined other choirs the Fellowship of Love Choir, the Halleluiah Coral Ensemble, the Pauline Wells Lewis Choir, James Cleveland Workshop Choir and attended all out of town James Cloverland workshops.

Earl was a culinary expert. He loved to cook. He was not selfish when it came to sharing his meals with others. Earl hosted many dinners as well as weekly feasts at his home for himself and for others. Earl loved seeing friends enjoy his cruise!

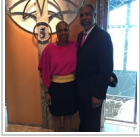
