Eddie Scott was born on October 17, 1955, to the late William and Treva Scott in Baltimore, Maryland. After suffering from kidney disease, he was called home to be with his Lord and Savior on Wednesday, May 13, 2026. No more pain, no more suffering ... To know him was to love him and his pure heart

Eddie received his education in the Baltimore City Public School System graduating from Carver Vocational High School in 1973. After leaving high school, he continued his education at Morgan State College, where he earned his degree in Business Administration. He worked with his brother, William Scott (deceased), at National Concrete Company for many years. Then he went to work with his nephew, Charles Ellis Jr., at Destination Transportation in Chicago, Illinois. After returning to Baltimore, he began working at Hertz as a transporter before retiring due to health problems. In June 1994, Eddie and Vernell were united in holy matrimony, and from this union, two families were united together; twos, Lamont Sims and Eddie Scott Jr. (deceases). As Eddie and Vernell were united together in the Lord, the family also became one. Eddie loved to cook, fish and raise plants. In 2024, Eddie was diagnosed with kidney problems and was placed on the kidney donor list.

In 2023, he accepted Christ as his savior at The Lord's Church, Baltimore, Maryland. Eddie was preceded death by his wife, Vernell Scott; his son, Eddie Scott Jr, one sister, Edna Scott: and three brothers, Thomas, William Jr, and

Roy Scott.
